Speaker

Don Keller introduced General McPeak. 37 years in AF, was AF Chief of Staff. Two years in Thunderbirds.

Raised in Grant's Pass.

At the start of the Cold War. Talked about his trip to the practice field at Wheelis in F100 (first fighter to have drag chute as standard equipment). Was flying and on guard channel they heard the recall word (there was a practice recall and a real recall). They heard the real recall and thought it was wrong and the CO went to guard ch and told

them not to use the real, but it was a real recall back to England. They took three hours to get back. He was in B flight 79th Squadron. The recall was at the start of the Berlin Crisis when the Berlin Wall went up. Mike Dougan and him.

Fast forward later to when both him and his wingman are both 4 star Generals. He was in charge in Pacific, and he was in charge in ETO. This was during the 1989 -- both were Lts in the same unit before the Berlin wall went up and both were 4 stars when it went down.

Mike was the AF Chief of staff during Desert Shield. He held an impromptu press conference in the a/c on the way back. He gave colorful talk to the press and some of this was not liked by the Chief of Staff and Dick Cheney. Thus he took over from his friend.

He went to Saudi Arabia and did practice flights with the F16s over Iraq with other squadrons (like 5 times) since he was still current. Cheney, the President heard about it and was called to a meeting. Had to do this and get back to his desk by January 19th. Colin Powell was not too happy about the whole desert storm. The present told him that no to worry about his flights.

This was when Barbara Bush had a cast on and he met her in her bed with a Cast in her PJs with the President and their two dogs!
